I was reading a novel last week that, while exciting and action-packed, did involve a scenario that made me sit up and take notice. In the book, the country had had its power grid shut down for a long period of time. The main characters in the book had homes that had been built with auxiliary generators that ran on solar and wind power, and they had a well that would provide water for years to come, as well as a supply of food and batteries. They weren't anarchists or conspiracy theorists, they just believed in being prepared (of course, it helped that they had money for all that stuff).

I have to admit it made me look online for ways to generate power when the electricity is out. And that wasn't good, because being the gadget freak I am, I wanted all of it: The fire pit with the device that turned the heat from the fire to electricity you could charge your devices on, the portable generator with the solar panels, all of it.

There are several things Scripture teaches us to be alert and prepared for. It says to be prepared for Satan's attacks: *"Stay alert! Watch out for your great enemy, the devil. He prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour"* (1 Peter 5:8 NLT). It teaches us to be prepared to share our faith: *"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have"* (1 Peter 3:15 NIV). It also tells us to be prepared for Jesus' return: *"... Keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come"* (Matthew 24:44 NIV).

We've all learned a little bit about being prepared in the last few months. I mean, after the run on the grocery stores in March, how many of you have enough TP, disinfectant, and canned food in the pantry now to last you for months? Uh huh. I thought so. And there's wisdom in being prepared for these things. But we need to make certain we're prepared spiritually as well. Prayer, study, and strong Christian friendships can help us be prepared for the temptations Satan throws at us, opportunities to share our faith, and struggles that we face on a daily basis, so that when Christ returns, we're ready.

**SACKS OF HOPE**



Remember The Children provides a home, food, education, love and spiritual leadership to children who have been orphaned in Romania and Tanzania. This year they will virtually provide Sacks of Hope at Christmas for these children. They will receive financial donations and the house parents will purchase items for sacks to give to each child.

If you would like to participate in this ministry a Sack of Hope will cost around \$15 per child. You may write a check to CACC ear-marked for Sacks of Hope or there are envelopes at the information center for you to provide cash. A group donation will be sent to Remember the Children from CACC.

A card will be placed in each Sack. You may provide your own card or we will have cards from Remember the Children for you to write a note.

The deadline for donations and cards is Sunday, October 25 to allow them time to ship the cards in time to prepare the Sacks of Hope.
