13 "But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? ${ }^{14}$ Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. ${ }^{15}$ Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?'" Matthew 20:8-15 (NIV)
